Seiji: (*Reading the email*) Mom recommends Japanese lacquerware vase or tray for the wedding present. She says lacquerware is light and not fragile, and so suitable for long journey.

During the night, we have sleep cycles—we go from sleeping lightly to sleeping deeply, and then into a dreaming sleep called REM sleep. REM stands for rapid eye movement, because during this sleep our eyes move about even though they're closed. Usually, people sleep talk during lighter sleep, when a small part of the brain is awake. Lots of children talk in their sleep, and it's totally normal. In fact, people do quite a few different things in their sleep, like laughing, groaning, and even whistling!

Sleepwalking usually happens within the first few hours of sleep, when you have really slow brainwaves. Your body goes on the move, but your brain is still really sleepy. Experts don't know exactly why some people sleepwalk, but they do know it is more common in children. Special chemicals that make you grow might wake you up, too. Sleepwalking can happen because you're worried, or you have a temperature, or you get partly woken up by a loud noise.





- 5. As for Thailand, which category has the biggest difference between "Budget for Yourself" and "Budget for Family and Friends"?
- 6. Name the country or area whose Category E has the smallest difference between "Budget for Yourself" and "Budget for Family and Friends"?
